



STUDY OF MEDICAL TREATMENT FOR METHAMPHETAMINE ADDICTION

UCLA is conducting a clinical research study to find out if a medication can help people to stop using methamphetamine and to determine if a person's genetic makeup influences their ability to quit methamphetamine. The study lasts for up to 18 weeks and involves visits to the research clinic for treatment and assessments.

Participants will receive a combination of medication and counseling treatments for methamphetamine addiction and will provide a blood or saliva specimen for genetic testing.

If you are 18 years of age or older and need help quitting methamphetamine, you may qualify to participate at our research clinic in Hollywood. Counseling, study medication, and compensation are included.
